Collection Summary: This collection consists of records related to the William H. Prescott House at 55 Beacon Street, Boston, MA, the headquarters of the National Society of the Colonial Dames of America in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (NSCDA-MA). It includes the history of the Prescott family, the usage of Prescott House by the NSCDA-MA, and the preservation of Prescott House. The NSCDA-MA is a non-profit organization that promotes our national heritage through the preservation of historic buildings and artifacts.

Collection Details

Collection Description: This collection documents the architecture, history, physical buildings, grounds, and administration of the Prescott House as well as the biography, genealogy, and history of William Hickling Prescott and other occupants of the house. Materials include manuscripts, correspondence, drawings and plans, print materials, photographs, and prints. The collection is currently stored in the Archives of the NSCDA-MA. This collection will be of interest to researchers studying the history of Boston in the nineteenth century; the occupants of the house and their families including William Hickling Prescott, James Smith Colburn, and Franklin Gordon Dexter; the architectural history of early nineteenth-century homes; and women's groups and women's history.

Biographical Note: The William H. Prescott House, located at 55 Beacon Street, was commissioned by Boston merchant James Smith Colburn in 1808. It was designed and constructed, along with the adjoining home at 54 Beacon Street, by American architect Asher Benjamin. It is the western unit of the pair of identical five-story, bow-fronted brick row houses adjacent to the Boston Commons on the northern side of Beacon Street. They reside within the Beacon Hill Historic District established by the Massachusetts Legislature in 1955.

William Hickling Prescott lived in the house from 1849 to 1859. Born on May 4, 1796 in Salem, Massachusetts, Prescott was an early American historian, who played a significant role in the development of history as an academic discipline. His books include histories of the Spanish monarchs and the conquests of Mexico and Peru. Prescott made major renovations to the house including a rear addition with his extensive library on the second floor and a third floor study. William Hickling Prescott's widow, Susan Amory Prescott, lived in the house until her death in 1869, when it was purchased by her nephew, Franklin Gordon Dexter. The Dexter family occupied the house well into the twentieth century.

The Prescott House was purchased by NSCDA-MA in 1944. In 1968, the NSCDA-MA thoroughly restored William Hickling Prescott's study based on plans drawn for Prescott as well as a contemporary sketch. Original architectural elements of the William H. Prescott House were modified by subsequent owners.
